

THE STORY IN BRIEF

ACT 1 - THE COURT OF KING HILDEBRAND

King Hildebrand and his court are awaiting the arrival of Princess Ida, to whom Hilarion (King Hildebrand's son) was betrothed in infancy. To the annoyance of Hildebrand she does not arrive, but instead her father, King Gama, and his three none-too-bright sons do. Gama announces to the court that Ida has shut herself away in one of his country houses and formed a women's university. The castle is called "Adamant", and Princess Ida is adamant that she will repudiate her marriage contract with Hilarion, as well as refusing to acknowledge the existance of men. Hildebrand decides to hold Gama and his three sons as hostage until Princess Ida changes her mind. In the meantime, Hilarion decides that he, together with his friends, Cyril and Florian, will make their way into the castle to confront Princess Ida.

There will now be a 20 minute interval.

ACT 2 - THE GARDEN OF CASTLE ADAMANT

The ladies of the college are commencing term, and Princess Ida reads her inaugural address. The boys climb the wall, and finding some academic gowns, disguise themselves as maidens. Ida returns and accepts the three "maidens" into the college - she is too engrossed in her book to notice that they are already wearing academic gowns. Florian recognises his sister Lady Psyche and this puts them in a spot. Psyche, Melissa, and Lady Blanche (Melissa's mother) for reasons of their own, decide to keep the secret, but unfortunately, during the luncheon break, Cyril becomes drunk and gives the party away. Princess Ida is shocked at the discovery, and in her haste to escape the scene, falls in the river and is rescued by Hilarion. The ladies ask for mercy for the three boys, but Princess Ida stands firm on her vows. Meantime, Hildebrand and his army arrive with the Sons of Gama as hostages and threaten to tear the castle down unless the Princess repents. Ida and her women shout defiance at Hildebrand as the curtain closes on Act 2.

There will now be a 10 minute interval.

ACT 3 - THE GARDEN OF CASTLE ADAMANT

The women should be ready for battle, but gradually admit they are not as war-like as they would like to be. King Gama returns with a message from Hildebrand, that the issue be decided by pitting Hilarion, Cyril and Florian against King Gama's sons. Ida agrees, and when Hilarion and his friends prove victorious, decides to carry on her cause in the outside world by marrying Hilarion.

MAVIS FORD

Princess Ida

Mavis has sung in a vast number of operas and operettas. Her experience includes leads in THE MIKADO, THE GONDOLIERS, THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE, SISTER ANGELICA (Puccini), THE TELEPHONE (Menotti), IL SERAGLIA and THE MARRIAGE OF FIGARO (Mozart). She has been a member of Tudor Choristers and has sung solos in several oratorios. Mavis has performed lead roles in TRIALBY JURY, HMSPINAFORE, THE MIKADO and THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE for Diamond Valley Singers.



JOHN TACEY

Hilarion



John has a vast and varied musical experience. As a member of the Melbourne Youth Choir, John has performed before the Prince and Princess of Wales, and has also sung with Barry Manilow. He currently sings with the Faye Dumont Singers, of which he is also the manager/treasurer. As well as singing, John also plays the Clarinet and Bass Clarinet with the Croydon Concert Band. He is the deputy musical director and conductor of their No. 2 Concert Band.

John has performed in FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and, with the Victorian State Opera Youth Company, THE RIME OF THE ANCIENT MARRINER. In Diamond Vally Singers productions, John has portrayed Nanki-Poo in THE MIKADO, Richard Dauntless in RUDDI-GORE and Frederic in THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE.

ALLAN LUKE

Cyril

Allan began singing as a hobby in 1986, joined Diamond Valley Singers in 1987, and has sung tenor solos in various choral works.

He understudied Nanki-Poo (THE MIKADO) and Richard Dauntless (RUDDIGORE) and played Samuel (THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE) with Diamond Valley Singers. He has also played the role of Leonard Merrill (YEOMAN OF THE GUARD) with Babirra Players and Cox (COX AND BOX) with Ivanhoe Players.

Allan has been learning singing from Graham Ford since 1988.



ROBERT ALVES

Florian

Robert is an occasional musician. He was the plaintiff in TRIAL BY JURY - the first Gilbert and Sullivan performed by Diamond Valley Singers. He has appeared in a number of other Gilbert and Sullivan's including THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE, THE GONDOLIERS, PATIENCE and UTOPIA UNLIMITED.

Robert's forte is choral work and he is presently a member of the Kew Philharmonic Society choir.

Judith has been an active member of Diamond Valley Singers since its early days, after singing with Tudor Choristers and various other groups in the U.K., Perth and Canberra.

Gilbert and Sullivan roles with Diamond Valley Singers have included Pitti-Sing (THE MIKADO), and Ruth (THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE).

Judith keeps herself very busy studying singing and musicianship and performing as chorister and/or soloist with Diamond Valley Singers in concerts and oratorios. She has competed in eisteddfods at Bendigo, Footscray, Mordialloc and Doncaster/Templestowe and this year was awarded equal first place in the Lieder Section at Doncaster/Templestowe.

Rita studied music at the University of Wales and since arriving in Australia in 1967 has been involved with MELBOURNE CHORALE, TUDOR CHORISTERS and HEIDELBERG CITY CHOIR.

JAMES DOUGLAS: An actor (singer?) of little note, James was initiated to Gilbert and Sullivan in 1988 in RUDDIGORE and played dual roles as gentry and ghost. This schizoid tradition continued with 1989 with a pirate/policement split in PIRATES OF PEN-ZANCE. Finally, this year James secured the rank of Principal, Class 1 (one character) in a role perfectly suited to his ability - the part of basic stupidity.

KRYSTOF LEWANDOWSKI: This great dramatic role could not have been more suited to Krytof's multifarious talents. In classic "cinema verite" style, he plays the bumbling idiot with such consummate ease as to appear almost natural.. A thespian of considerable breadth (his armour had to be specially adapted), Krystof has landed (usually in a tangled heap) in a variety of roles over the years (details upon request - please



supply self-addressed postage stamp). Whilst his bass tones have long reverberated around the bathrooms of Eltham, it is only in recent years that he has allowed his dulcet rumblings to reach more discerning audiences.

CHRIS WEARNE: Although only 22, Chris has been involved in many musical productions with his school and church. Chris' first performance with Diamond Vally Singers was in THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE. As one of the three highly intelligent Sons of Gama, Chris believes he can fit into the role well and is looking forward to the performances.

Dianne's involvement with Diamond Valley Singers began as Assistant Producer for THE MIKADO in 1987. Since then she has participated in numerous DVS performances including solos in THE MESS-IAH. Dianne also took on the role of producer for RUDDIGORE and THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE.

DIAMOND VALLEY SINGERS

In 1985 Ian Lowe asked Graham and Mavis Ford to help with a performance of TRIAL BY JURY with the Eltham Orchestra. Rehearsals started and "Valley Musical Society" (later to become "Diamond Valley Singers") was born.

There were two performances of TRIAL BY JURY, which, combined with other items by the orchestra, raised \$1300 for World Vision. Because of nature of the cause, rehearsal venues were, and still are, provided free of charge by Diamond Creek and Greensborough Uniting Churches.

Since 1985, Diamond Valley Singers has performed three seasons of Handel's MESSIAH, four more Gilbert and Sullivans (HMS PINAFORE, THE MIKADO, RUDDIGORE and PIRATES of PENZANCE) and smaller works including Maunder's OLIVET TO CALVARY. They have also been involved in local Carols by Candlelight Services and Eltham and Greensborough Festivals and as part of the massed choir at CAROLS BY CANDLELIGHT at the Sidney Myer Music Bowl on Christmas Eve.

Proceeds to World Vision to date total over \$9,500. \$1650 has also been donated to Diamond Valley/Eltham Housing Service. This year, it has been agreed that the profits from PRINCESS IDA and other performances will be divided equally between Community Aid Abroad and the Diamond Valley/Eltham Housing Service.

Through the support of members of the company, none of whom are paid, Diamond Valley Singers hopes to continue to raise money to support groups such as those assisted in 1990, as well as providing opportunities for local singers.

The orchestra has been in existence for about thirteen years and during that time has performed three or four different programs each year. DIAMOND VALLEY/ ELTHAM HOUSING SERVICE

The Diamond Valley/Eltham Housing Service is a community based emergency housing service, for people who are facing housing related crises. The service operates four emergency houses for short term accommodation for families who in most cases are leaving situations of domestic violence and family breakdown. Due to their situation many families have no furtniture, food, transport or the money for same. Most cannot afford private rental accommodation and are awaiting Ministry of Housing accommodation.

The service receives funding from the Ministry of Housing towards the costs of power bills and maintenance and to help pay rent and bond money for people in need. An increasing need is the supply of basic foodstuffs, furniture and other items most people take for granted. The Housing Service is reliant on the community for these goods as funding does not cover the purchase of such items.

COMMUNITY AID ABROAD

Community Aid Abroad is an organisation which works to bring about sustainable improvement in the living conditions of people who have little if any support from elsewhere. They do this by working with the people on projects put forward by the people provided that the projects meet Community Aid Abroad's guidelines for projects.

These guidelines have been developed from years of experience to improve the probability of the project succeeding and therefore making best use of available resources.

CAA relies on donations including those in response to the Walk Against Want and Work Against Want events, and the sales of goods sold on behalf of people with whom they are working (a catalog is available from their office or visit Shop 12 in the Myer Arcade).

There are also CAA branches in many suburbs raising funds through a wide variety of activities and also providing information to members and community so that informed action can be taken to help improve the balance in the distribution of world resources.
