# **SYNOPSIS**

#### ACT 1

The house of Gabriel and Rosalinda Eisenstein. The voice of Alfredo, an opera singer and old flame of Rosalinda can be heard beneath the balcony, Alfredo wanting desperately to rekindle his affair with the lady of the house. Adele, the Eisenstein's chambermaid laments the fact that she is not a member of the aristocracy An invitation arrives to a party that evening at the villa of Prince Orlofsky, a rich Russian emigre. The invitation is presumed to be from Adele's sister, Ida. It encourages Adele to ask for the evening off 'to visit her poor sick aunt', to borrow one of her mistress' ball gowns and come to the party pretending to be a young lady of the aristocracy Rosalinda enters, having heard Alfredo's voice, and is far too preoccupied to listen to Adele's plea for the evening off. Gabriel is due to go to prison that evening, and they must all prepare for this. Once Adele has gone, Alfredo enters through the french windows and begins to serenade Rosalinda, promising to come and visit her during her husband's absence. Rosalinda agrees, to get him to leave, just as Gabriel arrives, with his lawyer, Doctor Blind. Not only did his appeal fail, but the judge had increased his sentence to eight days. Rosalinda protests her grief but is secretly looking forward to a tete-a-tete with Alfredo. Enter Doctor Falke, an old friend of Gabriel, and the 'bat' of the title. Falke has come to ask Gabriel to a party tonight, at Prince Orlofsky's villa and says that he has fixed it with the Prison Governor that he does not have to report to prison until dawn the next morning. He should come in disguise, as the 'Marquis de Renard', and Rosalinda need never find out. Gabriel agrees and rushes off to dress. Rosalinda calls Adele, and agrees to let her have the evening off, to visit her aunt. The Eisensteins then bid each other farewell, with Adele, each of the three secretly looking forward to what the evening will bring. Alfredo returns and begins the seduction of Rosalinda. He dresses in the clothes of the master of the house, as he intends to take over this role for the time of Gabriel's absence. The lovers are interrupted by the entrance of Frank, the Prison Governor, who has come to collect Gabriel, to escort him to prison. He naturally assumes Alfredo is Gabriel. Rosalinda quickly recovers the situation by convincing Frank that the very tipsy Alfredo is indeed her husband. Alfredo reluctantly agrees to go to prison for the sake of Rosalinda's reputation.

#### ACT 2

The party at Orlofsky's villa is in full swing. We are introduced to the host through his song "Chacun a son Gout", where he encourages his guests to relax and do as they please. Gabriel and Adele recognise each other He is, of course, introduced as the "Marquis de Renard" and she as "Olga" He points her out, and then is made to look ridiculous, as such a lady could not possibly be a chambermaid. To further complicate matters, Rosalinda enters, also in disguise, dressed as an Hungarian Countess and wearing a mask because she knows that Gabriel is also here, calling himself something else, and flirting with none other than Adele. Since Rosalinda is in disguise, she gets him to flirt with her so that she would have ammunition to use against him. Rosalinda lets Gabriel use his famous watch trick on her, where he attempts to hypnotise her into submission. She turns the tables however as she manages to get the watch away from him. The party then continues with the entire company singing to the virtues of His Majesty King Champagne.

Another guest is the mysterious Chevalier Chagrin (none other than Frank, the Prison Governor). The finale continues, with Doctor Falke singing to the virtues of Brotherhood, and all of Orlofsky's guests becoming more and more inebriated. The Act ends with Gabriel and Frank both leaving at six a.m. for their respective appointments (both at the prison, of course).

#### ACT 3

Set in the jail, Frogg, the Prison Guard is trying in vain to quieten his prisoner, Alfredo, who has been singing constantly His antics are interrupted by the arrival of an equally inebriated Frank. Soon, Adele and Ida arrive seeking out the mysterious Chagrin, and explaining that "Olga" is not really a lady, but a mere chambermaid, one who only needs a sponsor to help her to get started on her stage career This group is interrupted by the arrival of Gabriel, who discovers to his dismay that someone else has been arrested in his place. He quickly waylays Doctor Blind and, disguised as the lawyer, prepared to discover what has happened. Rosalinda then arrives, anxious to get Alfredo out of prison before Gabriel discovers him and together the two lovers ask for the help of the 'lawyer" Gabriel reveals his identity, accusing the two of deceiving him. Rosalinda then reveals what she knows about his own deceit, and the married couple reunite. Doctor Falke reveals that the entire evening was engineered to avenge the earlier episode where Gabriel had left him high and dry Eventually the blame for the entire evening is laid at the feet of the real culprit, His Majesty King Champagne!

As a year 11 student at St. Helena Secondary College, Erin is taking Drama and Year 12 Music.


We wish Erin well in her theatrical debut.



#### DIAMOND VALLEY SINGERS

In 1985 Ian Lowe approached Mavis and Graham Ford for help in staging *Trial By Jury* with Eltham Community Orchestra. Rehearsals began and "Valley Musical Society" (later to become Diamond Valley Singers) was formed to provide local singers with opportunities to be heard in public and to raise money for charity. So far, over \$45,000 has been donated to organisations such as World Vision, Community Aid Abroad, Eltham/Diamond Valley Housing Service, Harrison Youth Services and the Eltham Emergency Relief Fund.

Since the initial production of Trial By Jury Singers and Orchestra have combined in most Gilbert and Sullivan productions (H.M.S. Pinafore, The Mikado, Ruddigore, The Pirates of Penzance, Princess Ida, The Gondoliers, Iolanthe, Yeoman of the Guard and Patience), as well as Handel's Messiah, Haydn's The Seasons and The Creation, Vaughn-Williams' Fantasia on Christmas Carols and Spohr's The Last Judgement.

DVS has also performed other works, including Mendelsohnn's *Elijah*, and Maunder's *Olivet to Calvary*, taken part in local Carols By Candlelight services and sung in the massed choir at Carols By Candlelight at the Sidney Myer Music Bowl on Christmas Eve.

New members are always welcome. We rehearse on Wednesday nights at Diamond Creek Uniting Church. Rehearsals for our next endeavour, Mendelsohnn's *Elijah* commence on 24th July. For more information contact Graham Ford (Artistic Director) on 9439 3267

#### DIAMOND VALLEY & ELTHAM COMMUNITY ORCHESTRA

## **OPEN - HOUSE CHRISTIAN INVOLVEMENT CENTRES**

Open House, which began in Ivanhoe some 25 years ago maintains a program of support for needy people in the community The work is wholistic in nature and seeks to provide care, friendship and (informal) training in a supportive and encouraging atmosphere. It is based at three centres:

Ivanhoe: where there are clubs and a drop-in activities centre for adults and young people, open till 11.00 p.m.

Hurstbridge: where eight people live in two houses while recovering from alcoholism, drug dependency and mental illness. They learn living skills, undertake re-training programs and work, before re-entering the community.

Seymour which is the base for a small group camping program for teenagers and young adults.
