


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# Merinda (Rin) Gallagher - Director





# Ian Lowe - Musical Director



lan was a co-founder of DVS in 1985. For the first 14 years of DVS history he conducted the orchestra for both stage shows and oratorios. He then moved to the Diamond Valley Singers, and has been secretary, president and is now treasurer From the start of this century until recent years he has been our musical director for all shows. He started this show with much anticipation and energy, but about halfway through rehearsals had to withdraw due to an operation to remove cancer We wish him a complete recovery.

#### Director's notes

As a staunch lover of musical theatre it has always bothered me that there are so few leading roles for strong women. For those of us who measure our worth by our skills and talents rather than the girth of our waists and the length of our eyelashes, the roles that usually come our way are the witches, drunks and bitches! So to find a show with a leading lady who has personality, skill and grit is gold indeed. To learn that she is also a real character with a real history is even more exciting.

When I first spruiked the idea of *Annie Get Your Gun* to the DVS committee, there was concern about two main themes. The first was the perceived glorification of guns. Annie Oakley lived from the land. Learning to shoot at age eight, she supported her widowed mother and six siblings by selling game, and by the age of 15 had paid off her mother's mortgage. When Frank Butler, the travelling sharp shooter offered \$100 to anyone in Annie's county who could out-shoot him, Annie rose to the challenge. After missing on his 25th shot, Butler conceded defeat and Annie won the match. She went on to become the most famous female sharpshooter in Wild West history.

Annie Oakley did not shoot people. Despite the appalling political climate of the time, Annie was a champion of human rights. She taught thousands of women to shoot so that they could provide for themselves in a time when single mothers and widows were often left in poverty. Annie formed charities which supported women in a society with no social security and strong taboos about premarital sex. By the time of her death, Oakley had given all her prize money away to such causes.

The second theme of the show which raises alarm is the portrayal of the American Indian people (I use the term Indian here, rather than Native American, as that is the term used by Chief Sitting Bull to describe his people). It is always difficult to portray a figure from another culture in a sensitive way. This is especially so when there was approximately zero percent chance of us getting anyone to audition for the role of Sitting Bull who was of American Indian descent!

The original script for *Annie Get Your Gun* most certainly had some dubious portrayals of American Indians. The whole adoption scene and the song "I'm An Indian Too" is best forgotten. It is, of course, no longer acceptable to portray anyone from another culture as less than another, and the show was rewritten in 1999 to bring it up to current politically correct standards. Let's remember how far we have come as a society since this show was first penned in the mid 1940s and be hopeful that we as a species continue to evolve in a compassionate way. Goodness knows we still have a long way to go! But let's also remember that Annie Oakley, in real life, was adopted by Chief Sitting Bull and that theirs was a relationship of deep mutual respect. That this relationship could exist in the 1870s, when the Indian Wars were still fresh in the memories of those living on the "frontier" is a most extraordinary thing. That Chief Sitting Bull saw in Annie a kindred spirit, and a glimmer of the daughter he had lost in the massacres, is as profound an example of our shared humanity as one can conceive.

I am sure that when *Annie Get Your Gun* was being revised, the team must have discussed writing the part of Sitting Bull out altogether. After all, he is not central to the romance between Annie Oakley and Frank Butler and the show is certainly long enough already. It would surely have made publicity and casting easier, not to mention costuming! But to write Sitting Bull out of the script, when his relationship as adopted father to Annie was so significant; when his presence in Annie's life expresses so perfectly the kind of egalitarian person that she was; to write him out because people might feel uncomfortable about putting an American Indian figure onstage... well, surely that would be racist.

Directing *Annie Get Your Gun* has a been a challenge and a pleasure. The crew here at DVS have risen to every challenge I have thrown them. Mark Clark's sets sparkle under Michael Gerrish's lights, setting off Dianne Richter and Robyn Mulder's wonderful costumes. Dozens of people have contributed to make this show come to life. And the cast has given me lots of laughs! With its unforgettable Irving Berlin score and its quirky portrayal of these wonderful Wild West characters, we hope you enjoy our version of *Annie Get Your Gun*.

# The story of Annie Get Your Gun

#### Act 1

Annie Oakley was 'perhaps the best sharpshooter the world has ever seen' In this version of her life, she is caring for three younger siblings by shooting game and selling it to hotels. She happens to come to Foster Wilson's hotel at the same time as Buffalo Bill's Wild West show has arrived in town. It is the custom that, to introduce themselves to each new town they visit, Buffalo Bill challenges the best shooter in the town against his 'champeen' Frank Butler. Wilson puts Annie against Butler and Annie wins.

Annie introduces her younger siblings with the cheeky 'Doin' what comes natur'lly' Later the 'Moonshine lullaby' presents her in a motherly role.

The relationship between Frank and Annie fills most of the show. Frank's pride finds it very difficult to be beaten by a girl, but he also finds himself falling in love with her. To her he sings 'The girl that I marry' – which is quite the opposite to Annie's character and she responds with 'You can't get a man with a gun'

Tommy Keeler is a 'half-Indian' who throws knives as part of the show. The trusting girl who is his target is his girlfriend Winnie Tate: 'I'll share it all with you' However Winnie's older sister Dolly is racist, and determined that Winnie will not marry Tommy. Despite this, they do marry.

The romance between Annie and Frank continues with 'They say it's wonderful' and the womanising Frank confesses to his mates that Annie has won his heart: 'My defences are down'

Annie gradually outshines Frank in her abilities, publicity and tricks. She shows off her amazing skills with a new trick in an attempt to win Frank's admiration (and a proposal from him), only to lose him to the opposition show run by Pawnee Bill. His pride overcame his love. Although she seems to lose Frank, Annie does become the adopted daughter of Chief Sitting Bull, who agrees to put money into the show.

# Act 2

Winne and Dolly Tate join Frank in Pawnee Bill's show, staying in America. Dolly has Winnie's marriage to Tommy annulled, as she was less than 18 years old when it happened. Supported by Chief Sitting Bull, Buffalo Bill's show does a tour of the European capitals, receiving great acclaim and many medals, but little money. In fact they limp home on a cattle boat, with Annie still hoping to marry Frank: 'I got lost in his arms'

On arriving in New York, they are invited by Pawnee Bill to a reception, where Tommy and Winnie are reunited: 'Who do you love, I hope'

At the reception, it is revealed that both shows are broke, and the only solution is to merge. To finance the merger, Annie agrees to sell her medals: 'I got the sun in the morning' Annie and Frank also talk about a merger, though they disagree on the style: 'An old-fashioned wedding' However Frank's pride still gets in the way when he sees how many expensive medals Annie has earned while overseas, so Annie challenges him to a shooting contest.

Dolly dreams of marrying Frank, so she attempts to bend the sight on Annie's gun to make her leave the show. Caught in the act by Charlie and Sitting Bull, they realise that Annie needs to lose the contest to win Frank, so they adjust the gun.

Before the contest Annie and Frank sing the duet 'Anything you can do, I can do better' When Annie misses her first five shots (with the bent gun sight), Frank loans her his gun. She deliberately misses, to let Frank win, only to have Frank deliberately miss to make a tie. Both Frank and Annie want to be partners again – and get married: 'They say that falling is love is wonderful'

## Diamond Valley Singers (DVS)

This year DVS celebrates 34 years of music making! In 1985 the conductor of the local orchestra, lan Lowe, approached Mavis and Graham Ford for help in staging *Trial by Jury* with the Eltham Community Orchestra (as it was then called) for a concert in aid of World Vision. Rehearsals began and 'Valley Musical Society' (later to become the Diamond Valley Singers) was formed to provide local singers with opportunities to be heard in public, and to raise money for charity. So far over \$160 000 has been donated to organisations such as World Vision, Community Aid Abroad, Eltham/Diamond Valley Housing Service, Harrison Youth Services, Eltham Emergency Relief Fund and Open House.

DVS have performed most Gilbert and Sullivan shows. In the last few years they have presented American musicals: *Brigadoon, Oklahoma, Calamity Jane, Fiddler on the Roof, Kismet, Carousel, The Pajama Game, Hello Dolly, Once Upon A Mattress*, and Cinderella.

We now regularly perform shows involving children; so far we have performed seasons for Aladdin Jr, and A Kidsummer Night's Dream. The youth program will start again in late July.

New members are always welcome. There are no auditions for chorus members. Adult rehearsals are held on Wednesday nights at Diamond Creek Uniting Church.
