The Story...

Rodgers and Hammerstein's enchanting adaptation of the timeless fairytale, Cinderella, was their only musical originally composed for television. When the television program, starring Julie Andrews as Cinderella, first aired in 1957, it was the most widely viewed program in the history of the medium at that time. Based upon the classic fairy tale, and particularly the French version Cendrillon ou la Petite Pantoufle de Verre, Rodgers and Hammerstein's adaptation brings new life to the story of a young woman forced into servitude who dreams of – and achieves – a better life.

Act I

A kingdom celebrates its Prince's decision to give a ball for the express purpose of finding a bride. In addition to all her other jobs, which include cooking, sewing, cleaning, washing and everything else imaginable Cinderella must help them get ready for the ball. She retreats to her "own little corner" and dreams of a more exciting life. The Queen and King are not in complete agreement about the Prince's ball. But the Queen has her heart set on it, and neither the King nor the Prince can bear to disappoint her.

On the night of the ball, Cinderella helps her Stepmother and Stepsisters get ready. After they leave, she sits alone in her corner and imagines what it might be like at the ball. She's not alone for long, however, for her Godmother appears. She is no ordinary godmother. With help from the Godmother's "fol-de-rol" and "fiddley dee," Cinderella is magically transformed for the ball. Her carriage, changed from a pumpkin, drawn by horses that were mice a moment before, whisks her to the palace.

Act II

Cinderella is the most beautiful of young ladies at the ball and the Prince falls in love with her. She must remember to leave before midnight before her carriage changes back into a pumpkin.

As she escapes, Cinderella loses her slipper, which the Prince retrieves. He mounts a search for the foot that fits the slipper.

He finally knocks on the door of Stepmother's house and, just when it all looks lost, Cinderella appears and slipper fits her perfectly.

The Royal Wedding begins. As the curtain falls on the happy couple, the Godmother reminds everyone that "Impossible things are happening every day."

Lucas has been enjoying singing and the stage since an early age, and fondly remembers playing a page boy in Diamond Valley Singers' 1991 production of *The Gondoliers*. Since then, his experience in the theatre has included the favourite roles of Will Parker in Rodgers and Hammerstein's *Oklahoma!*, the title role in *The Mikado* with GSOV and Captain Corcoran in *HMS Pinafore* with MonUCS, as well as a variety of other musicals and non-musical plays.

Besides his theatrical endeavours, Lucas is an experienced chorister and vocal soloist. He has featured in a number of oratorios and choral works, including Verdi's and Faure's *Requiems*, Dvorak's *Te Deum* and Handel's *Messiah*, as well as singing a wide variety of choral works. He currently sings with the Australian Chamber Choir, and toured Europe with that choir in 2013 and 2017.

Lucas shared the privilege of conducting DVS's choral programs in 2014-2017, as well as serving as Musical Director for *Hello, Dolly!* in 2014 and *Once Upon a Mattress* in 2016.

Marie-Louise Wright - Conductor



Originally from Graz Austria Mary studied Violin with Tim Wachtel, Zefferino Mendes and Warwick Stengards and conducting with Robert Rosen, Peter Clinch, Marvin Rabin, Jerry Nowak, Robert Culver. She attended Symphony Australia workshops in Melbourne, Adelaide and Tasmania, and a workshop with the Royal Australian Navy Band and the Cairns Winter School for Orchestra. She currently conducts Surrey Hills Orchestra, Eltham Orchestra and its two string ensembles, and teaches strings at Briar Hill Primary School. Past conductor of Henry Touzeau Strings for Melbourne Youth Music, Preston Junior Strings and Victorian Concert Orchestra.

She has conducted many operettas including *Gondoliers*, *Merry Widow*, *Merrie England*, *Mikado* and *Iolanthe*. She has also conducted musical theatre productions of *Oklahoma*, *Calamity*

Mary has also been privileged to conduct 8 out of the 9 Beethoven Symphonies. Her favourite music is Ballet especially that of the Romantic Era. Mary also likes to dabble in costume making and this year has made the costumes for the Stepsisters, Ball gown for the Queen and the dresses for the Flower girls.

Angela comes from an equestrian management and public relations background, and fell into the musical world, accidentally, much like *Alice in Wonderland*, a role she played while still at school. Elizabeth Carr - Grace (Stepsister)





Rachel Bottomley






John Leahy

Frank Meerbach






